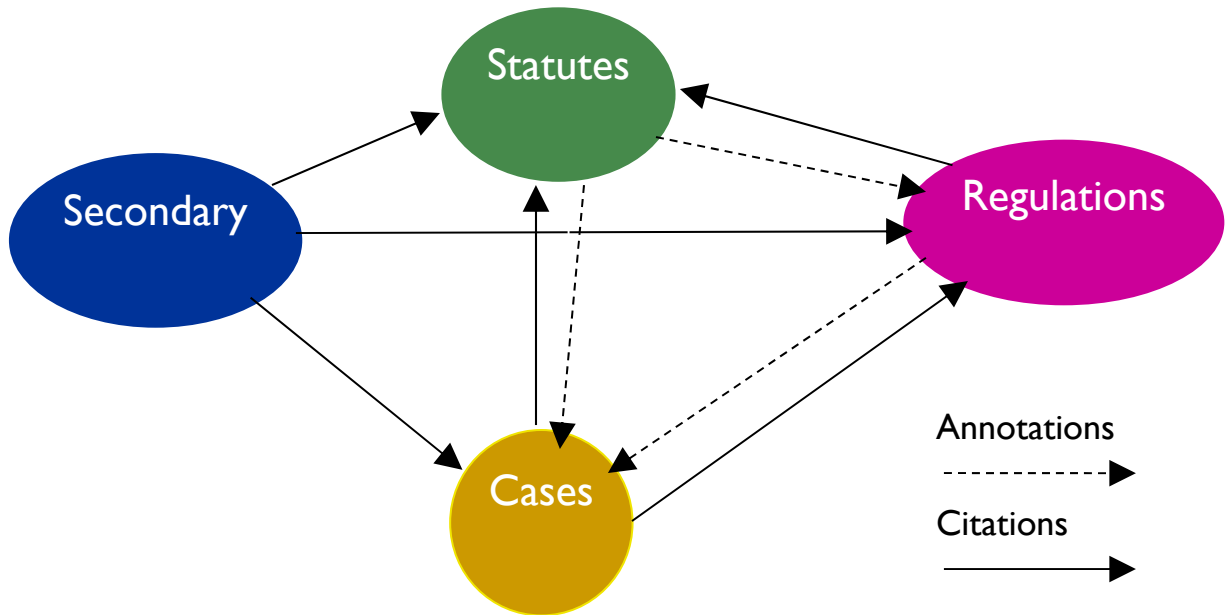
## Secondary Sources

- Treatises range from simple ones you can buy to very expensive, very comprehensive ones you'll want to access in the law library.
  - CEQA Example:
    - J. William Yeates, Esq., *Community Guide to the California Environmental Quality Act* (Planning and Conservation League Foundation, 2007) 36 pages, \$35 from [www.pcl.org](http://www.pcl.org)

- Tina A. Thomas, James G. Moose & Whitman F. Manley, *Guide to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)* (11th ed., Solano Press 2006) 1200 pages, \$85
- Federal (and general state) Law
  - American Jurisprudence (Am Jur)
  - Corpus Juris Secundum
  - ALRs (“annotations”)
- California
  - California Jurisprudence (Cal Jur) – legal encyclopedia
  - Witkin Summary of California Law – super treatise
  - Miller & Starr California Real Estate – super treatise
- Law Reviews
  - Loyola Law Review
  - Resource: Hein Online (especially for older issues)

### Research Strategy

- Start wherever you have an entry point into the web, depending on what you know about the particular area of the law.

  - California Cases – by citation and full-text search
